

Dr. Julie Finlayson

Julie worked in the Education Office of the National Museum of Victoria between 1978-8 where her interest in anthropology was first ignited. These days Julie is the current Research Fellow at the Centre for Native Title Anthropology (CNTA) holding the position since 2016. The Centre was founded at the ANU in 2004.

Julie is a social anthropologist with work experience and research in cultural tourism, land claim and native title work, and Indigenous housing. During her time in the Australian Public Service she managed the Indigenous Legal Aid program, night patrols in the Northern Territory (NT) under the NT Emergency Response (NTER) in the Attorney General's Department, and the community development aspects of the Community Employment Development Program (CDEP) in FACSIA.

In partnership with Anthropos Consulting, for several years Julie ran short summer courses in native title anthropology. She also taught anthropology at La Trobe University and published as a Research Fellow at the Centre for Aboriginal Economic Policy Research (CAEPR) at the ANU between 1995-2000.
